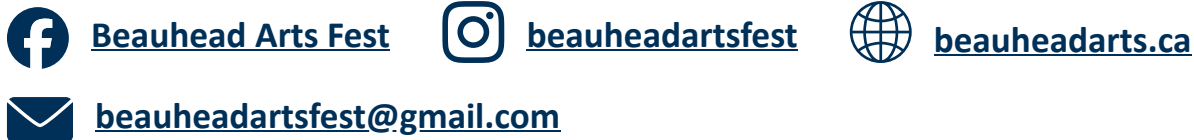

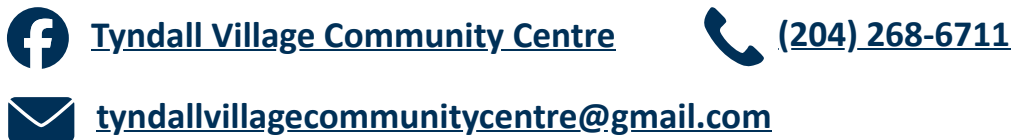
BEAUSEJOUR BROKENHEAD COMMUNITY GROUPS



Beauhead Arts Fest is a vibrant celebration of art and creativity in the Beausejour Brokenhead community. Since its inception in 2018, the festival has provided a dynamic platform for Manitoba-based artists to showcase and sell their work in the historic setting of the Pioneer Village Museum. Visitors can explore art exhibits, interactive workshops, live performances, and delicious local food in a one-of-a-kind atmosphere.



Tyndall Village Community Centre, located at 69 Pierson Drive in Tyndall aims to offer social and recreational opportunities for residents of the LUD. The TVCC hosts a number of activities and events throughout the year, plus has an outdoor rink and a public splash pad.



Garson Centennial Community Centre, located at 11 Thompson Ave in Garson aims to promote recreational, social and cultural activities for all who enter its doors. They host a variety of events each year including Meat Bingo, Crafts Shows, Community Breakfasts, Car Show, and more. They also rent their 3600sqft space that includes a commercial kitchen, sound system, and projector screen.



Brokenhead River Community Hall, located at 320 Veterans Lane in Beausejour aims to create a space where everyone in the community feels welcome. They host craft shows, family fun days, sports watch parties, plus offer wedding/social and meeting rental rooms, and so much more.

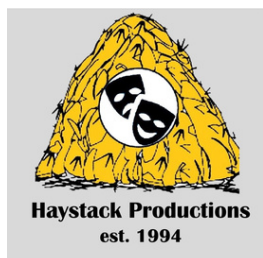
